He piloted the September 30, 1994 Space Shuttle Endeavour mission, the September 16, 1996 Atlantis mission and commanded the January 22, 1998, Space Shuttle Atlantis mission and the September 08, 2000 Atlantis mission to the International Space Station. The retired Marine Corps Colonel now serves as director of Safety & Mission Assurance at the Johnson Space Center in Houston. A proud WKU alumnus, Wilcutt returns to campus to share his 20 years of experience as a NASA astronaut and to discuss the future of the U.S. Space
